

Yet, plastics - whether disposable or durable - cause pollution at almost every stage of their lifecycle, starting with the use of fossil fuels for their production and micro-plastic contamination of the marine environment at the disposal stage. Innovation is required to redesign packaging and accelerate the transition to a circular economy. The seminar, delivered by Dr McCarthy, Senior Lecturer in Marketing, focuses on consumer response to sustainable packaging and draws on models of behavourial change

#### PROJECT OF THE MONTH

Dr Janice Scarinci, A/Prof Josephine Pryce and Dr K Thirumaran are recipients of the JCU Collaborative Research Grant for 2020 and 2021. The project is titled **From University to Industry to Economies,** and it seeks to determine if the employability skills needed in the Tourism, Hospitality and Events Industry in Australia and Singapore have changed since the pre-COVID era. Currently, two publications are progressing, but the research team foresees even more publications on the horizon as this is a vast project with huge potentials.
