You will participate in mock hearings and bail applications. The Cairns Police Prosecutions Work Experience Placement Program (CPP WEPP) will give participants an introduction to criminal law advocacy and pave the way for potential employment as a prosecutor at Cairns. You will be mentored by prosecutors and provided with feedback.
