Attend Orientation Week information sessions and social activities, and get to know your lecturers, your classmates and your campus.
Go to 'My Finances' in eStudent to review your fees, charges, due dates and deferral options. Check your fees are listed in Deferrable Transactions in eStudent if deferring payments to a HELP loan.
Log on to LearnJCU to find out information from your lecturers about your subjects, including textbook lists, assessment topics, deadlines and grading information.
Find out about Student IT Essentials at JCU. Learn about JCU free software (Office 365), computers, printers, email and wireless networks.
Become part of our virtual communities through Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn and more!
Register for AccessAbility Services if you have a temporary or permanent disability, health condition or injury that might impact your studies .
Familiarise yourself with free student services at JCU and how they can help you succeed – AccessAbility, Accommodation, Careers and Employability, Counselling, Indigenous Education and Research Centre, International Student Services, JCU Student Association, Learning Advisors, Library, Student Centre, Student Mentors and Student Wellbeing.
Investigate the various options for transportation to and from JCU, including parking and tertiary transport concessions .
