Social Work career pathways are varied. Depending on the field of practice chosen, Social Workers utilise skills and experience in management, education, research, policy development, politics and community planning.

Services which Social Workers provide, include therapy, casework, advocacy, mediation, group work to individuals, couples or families to address issues such as mental health, sexual assault, family violence, loss and grief, illness, separation and substance addiction. Social Workers may contribute to

policy development and advise governments on welfare issues.

Reflect on your experiences and keep records of tasks tackled and skills developed. This will greatly assist your future job applications and interview responses.

In addition to your field placements, it is recommended you actively **seek** additional social work-related volunteer or paid opportunities to expand your experience and professional networks.

Volunteer Work

Volunteering is an opportunity to give to the community, grow your professional and community networks and demonstrate extra commitment to future employers and clients.

You could start with volunteering on campus as a Student Mentor.

Think of areas of Social Work that interest you and seek out volunteer opportunities in that area. For example, if you're interested in working in health, you could volunteer with a patient support group. If you wish to develop your counselling skills or crisis support experience, you could be a Lifeline Crisis Supporter.

Graduate Programs

Graduate programs are paid structured professional development positions offered by large organisations and government departments to recent graduates.

Successful applicants are provided on the job training and mentoring within the organisation. Candidates are usually recruited throughout their final year of study for commencement in the following year.

While many graduate programs will be tailored towards a particular degree, a number of organisations will run graduate programs recruiting from a wide variety of degrees.
