*James Cook University's Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) degree is a five year undergraduate course and is primarily for school leavers (i.e. applicants who have completed year 12 or equivalent in the last two years). A limited number of places may be available for non-school leavers.*

## Overview

This program aims to produce graduates of the highest academic standards, who can progress to veterinary practice and to further studies in veterinary specialties. Graduates will be uniquely qualified in the fields of rural/remote and tropical veterinary practice.

This course is accredited by the Australasian Veterinary Boards Council (AVBC). Graduates are eligible to practice as Veterinarians in Australia, New Zealand and UK.

## Submissions

Please read the information below before applying for the Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) course at James Cook University.

The Written JCU International Application Form can be submitted via a [JCU Agent](#) or [directly to JCU](#) on or prior to the closing date.

The application closing date is 31 August 2022. Applications received after this date will NOT be accepted.

## Summary of selection process

Applicants will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Academic performance in Year 12 studies and/or in subsequent tertiary studies
- Evaluation of the written component of the application form

In 2023, the College of Public Health, Medical and Veterinary Sciences has available approximately five places in the Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) course for international applicants.

## INFORMATION FOR THOSE STUDYING YEAR 12 OR EQUIVALENT IN 2022

- Provide documentation of your Year 12 examination results.
- The Prediction of Academic Achievement (PAA) sheet is to be completed by your School Principal/ Vice-Principal/Guidance Officer or Director of Studies (or equivalent) and emailed to: Admissions, [internationaladmissions@jcu.edu.au](mailto:internationaladmissions@jcu.edu.au), by 4pm (AEST), 31 August 2022.

## INFORMATION FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT STUDYING YEAR 12 OR EQUIVALENT THIS YEAR

- If you have not commenced any further studies since completing Year 12, please include a copy of your Year 12 Certificate or equivalent.
- If you have commenced or completed further studies please include a copy of your academic record to date.
- The most recent grade point average (GPA) score will be used to assess applicants who have commenced or completed tertiary studies. While an applicant's most recent GPA will be given the most weight, the applicants entire academic record will be considered when determining offers for places in the program.

## SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

Offers of a place in the Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) degree are made by International Admissions. Applicants are advised to check visa processing times with the [Department of Home Affairs](#).

## UNSUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

Applicants who are unsuccessful will be notified by Admissions. An applicant who has been unsuccessful in obtaining a place in the James Cook University Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) this year, but who is strongly motivated towards a career in the Veterinary Science field, might consider undertaking a Bachelor degree in Medical Laboratory Science, Biomedical Sciences or Science. Unsuccessful applicants

considering undertaking studies in one of the above degrees with a view to eventual acceptance into the Veterinary Science (Honours) degree, should however be aware that the number of places available for non-school leaver entry into the James Cook University Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours) is very limited, and it would be inappropriate and most unwise for an unsuccessful applicant to see that eventual outcome as any more than a possibility.

## English language requirements

Unless your education was undertaken in one of the following countries: Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa, UK or USA you will be required to meet the following English Proficiency requirement (Tests must be less than 2 years old at time of admission).

### ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST MINIMUM SCORES

**IELTS (academic module)** with a minimum overall score of 7 (no component lower than 7.0).

**OR PTE Academic** with a minimum overall score of 65 and a minimum score of 65 in each of the four communicative skills (listening, reading, writing and speaking).

**OR TOEFL (internet based)** with a minimum total score of 94 (23 in speaking, 24 in listening and reading and 27 in writing).

## Pre-requisite subjects

English (3/4, C), Mathematical Methods (Units 3/4, C), Chemistry (Units 3/4, C); or equivalent.

## Vaccinations

### Q FEVER VACCINATION

Students must provide evidence of being immune to Q Fever within the first teaching period of their studies. Students who are not immune to Q Fever will not be permitted on-site at some facilities and consequently this may result in their inability to complete the requirements of the degree as accredited by the relevant professional accrediting body. If a student has not complied with the above requirements by the last day of the first teaching period of their studies, their enrolment will be terminated.

The College of Public Health, Medical and Veterinary Science recommends additional vaccinations and students will receive information regarding these vaccinations at the commencement of their first year. This course may have specific admission requirements such as immunisation, the requirement to obtain a Suitability to work with Children Card, federal police check and/or other requirements that Students must comply with.
