## APPLICANT ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Registration standards: Applicants acknowledge that AHPRA Registration standards define
the requirements that applicants, registrants or students need to meet to be registered.
Graduate Certificate of Diabetes Education students need to have met (and must continue to
meet) AHPRA registration standards, codes and guidelines to remain in this course.

- 2. Residential school attendance: Applicants acknowledge that students are required to undertake a portion of the course via a block and/or limited attendance mode delivery (3-day residential school at Cairns Campus). Candidates not resident in the Cairns region are required to arrange travel and accommodation at their own expense.
- 3. Immunisations: Applicants acknowledge that students must provide evidence of being immune to hepatitis B and that they have been vaccinated or evidence that they are not susceptible for the vaccine preventable diseases (VPD) of Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR); Varicella and Pertussis. Professional experience placement is a requirement of this course and students may be engaged in roles where there is contact that would allow transmission of a VPD. Students are required to comply with the above requirement prior to commencing their first Professional Experience Placement or by the end of the first teaching period of their studies, otherwise their enrolment will be terminated. For more information, refer to the JCU Student Placement Procedure and Procedure for Infectious Disease.
- 4. Suitability to Work with Children Card (blue card): Applicants acknowledge that this course includes prescribed professional or clinical placements that may involve contact with children under 18 years of age. Students are required to obtain a Suitability to Work with Children Card (which involves a criminal history check undertaken by the Queensland Police) before the start of the first placement. Students must retain a current Suitability to Work with Children Card for the duration of their course, as failure to do so will result in the termination of their admission to the course.
